

Health & Safety

Handwashing: When to Wash and Tips to Make it Effective Staff and kids should wash their hands upon arrival at the child care program; before preparing, serving, or eating food; after eating, using the bathroom, changing a child's diaper or helping a child in the bathroom, wiping noses, mouths, sores, or cuts, handling body fluids, handling raw eggs, meat or poultry; any time your hands look or smell dirty.

To make handwashing more effective use liquid soap, warm running water, scrub hands for at least 20 seconds, and use disposable single-use towels. Don't forget to wash infants' and toddlers' hands too!

Grants
